In my capacity as Assistant Director of Oakland Community Housing, Inc. (OCHI), I was the main staffperson responsible for overseeing the acquisition and rehabilitation of Barrett Terrace and Barrett Plaza, a total of 173 apartments and townhouses in Richmond California. OCHI purchased these 20+ year old buildings in 1997 through the federal Low Income Housing Preservation and Rehabilitation program. We selected D&H Construction to inspect the properties prior to purchase, and to prepare a detailed cost estimate of necessary repairs, which we used to obtain HUD funding for the project. OCHI subsequently negotiated a final scope of work and construction contract with D&H Construction. Total construction costs were approximately \$3.3 million.

Throughout our working relationship, I was very impressed with Jeff Halpirin and D&H Construction's attention to detail and with their commitment to doing a good quality job. Rehab of occupied buildings is always a challenge, but D&H demonstrated a mastery of scheduling which helped the project go extraordinarily smoothly, and minimized the time that tenants were displaced from their units. The Barretts also presented challenges about how to repair dry-rotted decks and how to re-design the heating ductwork in many of the units.
